

◆ Statewide Transfer Admission Agreement ◆

I had the honor of redesigning the Transfer Admission Agreement between the College of Engineering at U.C. Santa Barbara and over 100 California community colleges. The existing agreement drafted in the early 1990s, was antiquated and frequently required four years at the community college to complete the extensive required course pattern – in the last decade, less than five students were admitted to an engineering major via the old agreement.

Using information from the California Engineering Liaison Council, *www.assist.org*, College catalogs and individual major curriculum sheets, I created a new transfer admissions agreement. The new course pattern could be completed at the community college in two years, without compromising the potential quality, or preparedness, of the transfer students. With quick approval from the Associate Dean of Undergraduate Studies, the Campus Articulation Officer and the Director of Admissions, the new information was posted on ASSIST and I began marketing the new agreement to community college students, advisors and faculty.

I am currently working with the Chair of Computer Science in redesigning the Transfer Admission Agreement for the CS degree offered through the College of Letters and Science.
